

The guy in seat 6H is snoring and everyone else is asleep. I am sitting here awake in the dark visualizing the line around Heartland Park and wondering why I couldn't get slowed down correctly in 12 so I don't scrub off speed and enter the straight after 14 without enough revs to get the turbo spooled up when I can do it so well in my head. After 18 months of Porsche ownership and breakfast gatherings, your obedient servant signed up and attended his first DE this weekend. Arriving with no small amount of trepidation (what will the cool guys think?], I was amazed at the organization and just plain fun that was to be had. Starting precisely at 0800 with Richard Bennett's "Let's get rolling, mates" whistle, every phase of the program is ticked and tied and goes off without a hitch. Al Hess is personally getting gallons of Starbucks coffee and dozens of donuts at 0645 for gosh sake. A bunch of the old-timers (read that to mean "quick guys") come in and welcome the rookies and all ask the same question, "Are you having fun, and is there anything you need?"
