

Another thank you goes to Aristocrat Motors who hosted their new line of cars by Maserati on August 26th. This fascinating line of vehicles drew quite a crowd and we all enjoyed the Italian food and beverages. A sign-up sheet for test drives was remarkably barren as the designated test drive day was August 27th and apparently folks just had too many important things to do than drive a Maserati . . . WHATEVER!!!

Past President of the Mercedes Club, Bob Del Popolo, took the first test drive slot of the day, and I took the last. Needless to say I was pretty geared-up that entire day before the test drive. I had no idea what I was in for . . .




