944 SPEC/SP1 Build, Part 6:

Wrapping It Up

Well, you guys are probably tired of hearing me ramble on about the SPEC build, so I am going to wrap it up this month. What is to come next month? I'm not sure, but surely I can think of something. Again, I need to edit my edit from last month concerning the Autopower roll bar. After talking to a few SPEC region directors, they are telling me that the new Autopower bar is indeed legal, and that we were incorrectly informed about it being illegal by the local NASA region tech inspectors at the race the car attended. The horizontal bar does not have to meet the diagonal bar, but if it does, it has to be welded a certain way is what I was told. This is the most current information I have. Where does that put us? Well, I'm not sure exactly as to who is correct, but hopefully it was just a local (not local Kansas City) NASA error.

I have gone through the brief basics on building a track car for the SPEC or SP1 series over the last couple of months. In the first issue we talked about some basic costs involved in building the car. Since then, we have gotten through the build and have been doing a lot of maintenance on Joel's race car due to 25 year



old items being worn out. While the build of the car was solid, we knew there were going to be some ongoing maintenance issues associated with starting with a cheaper car. Fuel lines, tank screens, oil leaks here and there, belts/ water pump, rod bearings, motor mounts, starters, etc all were at the end of their life span and needed to be addressed. By the end of the race/DE season, we are hoping to have wrapped up most of the maintenance issues associated with the car. So, like I mentioned in the first article, if you are going to start with a cheaper base car, then expect to have to spend some money tackling the issues that will arise from previous owner's neglected maintenance. Starting with that \$3,500 car seems like a better deal as the season drags out. With that being said, most of the money you spend on getting the car up and running is going to happen during the build process, and probably throughout the first couple of track weekends as you shake the car down and see what you have. This year we are over budget, but next year should be much easier on the wallet.

Another great option for getting into the SPEC/SP1 series is to buy a car from someone who has already spent the money on building a SPEC car. This, quite honestly, is the cheapest route to go considering the current economy. People are dumping their toys at a significant loss, so there are some smoking deals out there if you search hard enough. You will pay more up front initially, but if the car is already built, then you just need to tackle the maintenance issues as they arise.

One final note before wrapping this up......The best preventative maintenance advice I can give you.....store your race car inside when it is not being used. Cars that sit outside during the long off season and in between races are subjected to Mother Nature, and she will attack those 20 year old seals, gaskets, etc without any mercy. Keeping your nice track tires out of the weather is also going to extend their lifespan as well. For the guys who live in areas where it gets well below freezing during the winter months: if you are not storing the car in a climate controlled environment for the winter (and are running straight water + water wetter), remember to either drain the cooling system or swap in coolant for the winter months so your block doesn't freeze and crack.

By the time you read this, our track season will likely be over for the year and we will be started on the planning stages for next year's season. The winter months will allow us to tackle some projects that weren't pressing during the season, but will be nice to have done. Remember, if you are storing the car for the winter, to put the car away with a fresh change of fluids, top the gas off, add some fuel stabilizer, and start getting ready for next season.



Post Event - Shrimp Boil



An interesting cast of characters was on hand ranging from long time members to brand new ones. This


was the first Kansas City Region event that several of the newer members

Six weeks ago, I had the pleasure of attending my 24th Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance and Monterey Historic Races at Laguna Seca. For those of you who have also attended them, you know that each event has a featured marque. This year, Laguna Seca's marque was Porsche, so the race cars, as well as the more familiar models from early 356's to Panameras covered the Monterey Peninsula—what a treat!

During the week preceding the main events, are a number of other fantastic car happenings. On Monday, there is a show comprised of strictly Porsches and Ferraris on Ocean Avenue in Carmel. We arrive on Tuesday for the Concours on
