Panamera Test Drive at Aristocrat

Halloween 2009. The setting: Aristocrat Motors. The event: Porsche's grand unveiling of its new four-door sports sedan, the 2010 Panamera. For the driving pleasure of those who were lucky enough to be 21 years old and above (myself not included) there were two Panamera's; a Panamera 4S in Carbon Grey Metallic as well as a Panamera Turbo in Yachting Blue. Both vehicles were equipped with Porsche's quick-shifting PDK transmission. While I could not drive either of the new Porsches, nor the Jaguar XF, Maserati Quattroporte, or the Mercedes E63 AMG, I was lucky enough to take at least two rides in the back seats of all but the Jaguar.

From a rear-seated viewpoint the Panamera 4S was smooth yet firm and very luxurious. There was, however, an undeniable presence of its 4.8 liter V8 engine that resonated nicely when accelerating. The engine had a sound reminiscence of the American V8 powered cars I have been in, but it had a tone quality that only a Porsche can provide. The Turbo, while it boasted more options than the 4S, was slightly quieter than the 4S - or so I thought until the driver gave it the full beans, which pushed the car forward with a surge of power and torque that the 4S lacked, opening up the exhaust and creating a simply fantasmic aura of power coupled with luxury. The very comfortable back seats in these cars had plenty of leg and head room available while fitting the shape of my body in a way that held me in place very nicely while

cornering. The new Panamera is possibly the most comfortable sedan that I have ever had the pleasure of riding in. Not only are the new cars comfortable, they are powerful: the 4S has an impressive 400 horsepower and 369 foot-pounds of torque while the turbo boasts 500 horsepower and 516 foot-pounds of torque, making both cars a blast to ride in and to drive (well, so I heard from the thrilled driver while pretending to drive from my rear-seated vantage point).

I also enjoyed the other cars; the Maserati's power was similar to that of the Panamera 4S, but it had the unmistakable exhaust note of an Italian sports car. This made for an utterly amazing experience that melted (in a good way) the sports-car enthusiast in me. I absolutely loved the sound! While it lacked some of the comforts the Porsche had, it definitely made up for this in the aesthetics department. The exhaust note and upholstery resembled a sports car with plenty of carbon fiber thrown around the interior while maintaining a sedan feeling with its four-door layout and smooth ride. As for looks, the new design of the Panamera was more attractive to me than the Maserati. The Porsche seems to be more sleek and modern to me. The Mercedes was a different story, with its 6.2 liter normally aspirated motor that produced 507 horsepower and 469 foot-pounds of torque; easily making it

the quickest car in the group. The interior was luxurious and comfortable, second only to the Porsches. The engine sound was a loud and exciting one which grunted and roared like a true V8 should. While the Maserati sound was my favorite, the silly little American in me was thrilled with the raw powerful sound the Mercedes produced when rewed.

Overall the Panamera was excellent, as were the other cars. But as for sights and sounds the Maserati and Mercedes won my heart. Had the Panamera been blessed with a throatier, more pronounced exhaust note it would have won by a landslide. I enjoyed all of the cars, both looking at them and riding in them, which made this Halloween one of my favorites, ever.


After dinner, a champagne toast will be offered on the outside deck under the stars

and overlooking the city lights.



Liberty Memorial - Reprinted with Permission from Liberty Memorial


Paola Fun Drive Recap


